Some points to note:

Last Friday's liturgy was a fitting way to celebrate the gift of motherhood. Each Mother's Day, I am reminded of the importance of the role a mother plays in her child's life: it is a role for which a woman is often under prepared, as there is nothing like first-hand experience to provide the wisdom to 'get it right next time'. My greatest challenges whilst raising my children were: having enough *quality time* with them; recognising and supporting the development of *their strengths*; allowing *them the freedom* to develop their autonomy; and, above all teaching them about *hope*. Teaching your child to be hope-filled builds their resilience to overcome 'failure' and use their learning to develop new pathways to achieve their goals. Sitting with your child to talk about what they'd like to be better at and taking the time to support them in planning and achieving their goal is the most precious gift you can give. Teaching them that when they get stuck or hit a bump in the road, not to give up hope. Allowing them to struggle to achieve their goal, without controlling their every move, gives them a chance to experience success in overcoming life's obstacles and developing a healthy determination towards constantly becoming the best they can be.

- This week marks the beginning of NAPLAN testing; NAPLAN is a tool to provide input into how an individual student is travelling. At St Brendan's students are encouraged to undertake this testing as they would a normal day's lesson.
- All parents are reminded that you cannot approach another person's child for the purposes of reprimanding them; refer any concerns or incidents to a member of the Leadership Team. Likewise, even though it may be well intentioned, please don't phone or approach another parent about their child's or another child's behaviour. It can be embarrassing when you only know some of the facts or when you indeed are relaying a fictitious story.


On Thursday we will be celebrating St Brendan's Feast with a morning tea after mass and a sausage sizzle lunch for students.

A phoneme is a speech sound. The Phonological Strategy focuses on teaching students how to identify and distinguish between these sounds.

Breaking words up into their individual sounds, or *sounding them out*, supports the spelling of familiar and unfamiliar words.

When words become longer and more difficult to *sound out*, students are encouraged to break the words into syllables.

To help support your child, ask them to syllabify words whilst travelling in the car, using names or places of interest.
