At St Brendan's we focus on one of the four spelling strategies each day across K-6.

On Wednesdays we focus on the Morphemic Strategy; how words change form.

- The morphemic strategy involves recognising and understanding the way morphemes affect the meaning and tense of words.
- Part of morphemic language is changing the tense of a words.

When you change the form of a word to make it plural (more than one) follow this rule:

 Words ending with a consonant + y, change y to i and add es.

For example, look at the word "puppy", it ends with consonant "p" + y. Apply the spelling rule (change y to i and add es) = puppies

supply | supplies family | families party | parties

Students will use other strategies as they ask themselves; does it sound right? (*Phonological knowledge*) and does it look right? (*Visual knowledge*).

Next we will be focusing on the Etymological Strategy.




