Strategies to Support Spelling

As mentioned in previous weeks, the four types of knowledge we engage when spelling are phonological, visual, morphemic and etymological. To engage this knowledge and support our students spelling of new words we focus on a number of specific strategies. These include:

Sound - focusing on sounds within words - links to phonological knowledge

Visual - focusing on the way words look - links to visual knowledge

Meaning - thinking about word meaning - links to morphemic and etymological knowledge

Connecting - making connections with other words - links to morphemic and etymological knowledge

Checking - using live, print or electronic resources - links to visual knowledge

These strategies are not taught in isolation as no single strategy works for all words and all students. That's why it is important that we expose students to all strategies by modelling them in use and prompting them to use the strategies appropriate to spell the word they're attempting to write.

2020 School Fees

I wish to advise that in 2020, including both tuition and school resource fees will rise by 1.5%. There will be no increase in the Diocesan Building Levy.

This increase has been endorsed by the Diocesan Schools Finance Committee and the Bishop's Office and is at the low end of the possible range of increase that was communicated to parents in 2018.

In 2020 the fee structure for the first child in our school will be:

Kindergarten to Year 6:

Tuition Fee: \$ 1,631.00
School Resource Fee * \$ 549.00
Building Levy \$ 970.00 **TOTAL:** \$ **3,150.00**

I can confirm that sibling discounts on tuition fees will continue to apply as in previous years. These discounts provide a 20% reduction for the second child, 50% for the third child and 100% for fourth and subsequent children.

Families are reminded that those struggling to pay school fees or with any financial concerns should make contact with the Fee Liaison Unit at the Catholic Schools Office schoolfees@dbb.org.au or a member of the Leadership Team. No family desiring a Catholic Education will be excluded due to hardship.

I thank all our families for their ongoing commitment to our school and acknowledge and appreciate the sacrifices they make in order to ensure their children receive a Catholic Education.
