This will include painting, some work on fences, gutters and various other jobs. Over the next eight months, in excess of \$18 000 000 is being spent on our Diocesan schools.



With face-to-face learning returning, COVID restrictions being lifted each week, the "new normal" being restored, The Community Cottage thought it would be a good time to check in with how children are going with their friendships.

Supporting positive relationships with others is essential for child development and learning social-emotional skills. Friendships are good for a child's self-esteem; good friends help them to belong and make them feel good about themselves. Teaching and supporting them to learn social skills is important, it helps them join in conversations, develop lasting friendships, self-advocate, collaborate with others, problem-solve, help to achieve their goals, and sort out conflicts.


Think about the skills we need to be able to gain and maintain friendship. Skills like sharing (not only things but time in a conversation), listening, following directions, cooperating, respecting personal space (including if someone does not want to be touched or do an activity), making eye contact (without starring), using manners and how to enter and leave a conversation.

It is important for children to learn how to think about others, show empathy, and learn how to respect others. These need to come from within, as you cannot force someone to be nice and respect others.

The list shows some skills that are beneficial in social situations and developing and maintaining friendships. These are learnt, we are not born with these skills. They take practise and lots of it! Following directions Using manners Having a positive attitude Working with others Good hygiene Using polite words Taking turns Greetings Having patience Being a good sport Listening Personal Space

TIPS FOR DEVELOPING POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS

- Teach your child the values rather than letting them follow someone else
- Talk to your child(ren) about emotions and get them to describe their emotions to you. If your child shows difficulties, ask them to describe what they are feeling and work it out together
- Teach them to be kind, to themselves and others
- Teach your child how to compromise and negotiate. Unfortunately, we can't have it our way all the time. These are two great skills to help us speak up and listen to others



- Prompt for behaviours, if they are struggling or don't react well, give them encouragement and guidance in relation to what they could do
- Celebrate success! When your child does a skill well, reinforce it
- Praise them when you see them being fair, trusting and supporting
- Get to know your child's friends showing an interest in who they are friends with helps them to talk to you about them and any situations that occur
- Good parent-child relationships help them develop friendship skills. Spend time with your child, stay connected to them, actively listen to them
- If your child is having friendship troubles talk to them about what is happening. If you are unsure, visit your local library and see if they have any children's books on friendships and conflicts to help with the conversation
- Think about your child's strengths and interests. You may consider looking into extra curriculum activities which could create new friendships
- Role-play how to handle awkward social situations, for example, a group of children playing and you want to join in. Discuss how to go about this.

It is common for children (and everyone) to struggle with meeting new people or making friends at times. Keep encouraging them. If your child is not having any troubles making friends this is a good opportunity to remind them about how hard it can be for others and encourage them to think about what it might be like and to reach out to someone who might not have as many friends. Always remember our children learn from what they see, we need to model positive relationship skills for them to be able to practise and learn from.
